The serving of food and drinks for immediate consumption requires approval in accordance with § 12 of the catering law. The necessary licences are issued by the Ordnungsbehörde Augsburg.

No licence is required for serving samples for tasting; i.e. the serving of food and drinks for immediate consumption in smaller portions than the usual commercial size or for free catering for customers.

According to § 3 of the Betriebssicherheitsverordnung (operating safety regulation) there is to be done a risk assessment for the drink dispensing equipment. This is to define the type, scope and deadlines for the necessary inspections and nominate the persons appointed to carry out the inspection.

Latest applications must be rejected. Approval by the exhibition management does not replace approval by the Ordnungsbehörde Augsburg (Trading Standards Office).

EXCERPT FROM THE CHILDREN AND YOUNG PERSONS ACT

SECTION 2 | PROTECTION OF MINORS IN PUBLIC

§ 4 Restaurants and Pubs

- (1) Children and adolescents under 16 years of age are not allowed in a restaurant or pub unless they are accompanied by an adult who is in charge of them or an adult who has parental authority over them or if they have a meal or a drink during the hours between 5 a.m. and 11 p.m. Adolescents upwards of 16 are not permitted in a restaurant or pub between midnight and 5 a.m. unless they are accompanied by an adult who is in charge of them or an adult who has parental authority over them.
- (2) Sub-section 1 does not apply to children or adolescents who are travelling or who are attending an event sponsored by a youth welfare body.
- (3) Children and adolescents are not allowed in restaurants of a nightclub or bar mature or into comparable places of entertainment.
- (4) The responsible authority may grant exceptions to the provisions of sub-section 1.

§ 5 Dances

- (1) Children and adolescents under 16 years of age are not permitted to attend public dances unless they are accompanied by an adult who is in charge of them or an adult who has parental authority over them. Adolescents who are upwards of 16 are only allowed to stay until midnight.
- (2) Notwithstanding sub-section 1, children are allowed to stay until 10 p.m. and adolescents who are not yet 16 are allowed to stay until midnight, providing the dance is organized by a youth welfare body or if the event relates to the arts or local traditions.
- (3) The responsible authority may allow for exceptions.

§ 6 Amusement Arcades, Gambling

- (1) Children and adolescents are not permitted in public amusement halls or similar premises that predominantly serve the purpose of gambling.
- (2) Children and adolescents are only allowed to take part in games that are awarded with prizes if these are run in public at folk festivals, shooting match fairs, fun-fairs, specialty markets and such like, providing the prizes are of low value.

§ 7 Events and Establishments of Harm to Minors

Operators of public or corporate events that are of potential harm to the physical, spiritual or emotional wellbeing of children or adolescents may be instructed by the responsible authority to assert a ban on the attendance of children and adolescents. The imposition of such instructions may stipulate age or time limits or other conditions if, in so doing, the potential for harm is ruled out or significantly lessened.

§ 8 Locations of Undesirable Impact on Minors

If a child or adolescent is found to be at a place that threatens danger to the youth in terms of its physical, spiritual or emotional wellbeing, the responsible authority shall take the necessary steps to avert the danger, if necessary.

1. the child or adolescent may be ordered to leave the location
2. the child or adolescent may be taken into the care of someone who has custody of them in the sense of Section 7 sub-section 1 No. 6 of the Code of Social Law Book Eight or, if no one who has custody of the minor is immediately available, taken into the care of the youth welfare office. In difficult circumstances, the responsible authority shall inform the youth welfare office about the location and its potential harm to children.

§ 9 Alcoholic Beverages

- (1) The following bans shall apply to restaurants, stores and other public points of sale:
 1. Brandy as well as drinks that contain brandy or foodstuff that contains a not negligible volume of brandy is not allowed to be sold to children or adolescents.
 2. No other alcoholic drinks may be sold to children or adolescents who are younger than 16 years, nor are children or adolescents under 16 allowed to consume such beverages.
- (2) Sub-section 1 No. 2 shall not apply if adolescents are accompanied by an adult who is in charge of them.
- (3) Vending machines are not allowed to offer alcoholic drinks. This shall not apply if a vending machine is
 1. installed on premises that are not accessible to children or adolescents or
 2. installed on commercial premises where technical devices or continuous supervision ensure that children and adolescents are unable to access the machine. Section 20 No. 1 Gaststättengesetz – German Licensing Act - shall not be affected hereby.
- (4) Sugared beverages containing alcohol as defined in Section 1 sub-sections 2 and 3 Alkopoppssteuergesetz – Alcopop Tax Act - must not be sold without the label "Not to be distributed to persons under 18 years of age, § 9 German Children and Young Persons Act".
This notice is to appear on the finished packaging in the identical lettering and in the same size and colour as the brand name or product name or, if these are not present, the trade description of the product and, with bottles, on the front label.
